

SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

RATIONALE

A compulsory school uniform encourages children to feel proud of themselves and their school and helps to ensure equity in dress.

PURPOSE

That an appropriate choice of uniform is worn as described in the uniform schedule set out below.
That the uniform items are attractive, durable, comfortable and as moderately priced as possible.
That the uniform serves to identify the children as belonging to Selwyn Ridge School.
Opportunities for parent feedback will be made and considered in evaluation of the uniform.

GUIDELINES

The uniform will be made up of the prescribed items on the schedule. No substitutions will be acceptable without prior approval of the Principal.

All hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back or up. All hair ties should be in one of the uniform colours. Hair should be natural in colour.

No jewellery is permitted at school except for watches and earrings for pierced ears - studs only. Approved jewellery which has cultural or religious significance may be worn tucked inside the uniform shirt. If in doubt please check with the Principal or Deputy Principal.

Most uniform items will be available for purchase from the school, including a selection of second-hand items.

Parents are responsible for maintaining the uniforms to a high standard.

UNIFORM SCHEDULE

The prescribed uniform for Selwyn Ridge School will be:


SRP uniform available from school:


- School polo shirt, with the school logo
- Shorts, skorts, trousers, colour navy with the school logo
- Sweatshirt, colour navy, with the school logo
- School sun hat, colour navy (must be worn for all outdoor activities during Terms 1 and 4)
- School beanies, striped with the school logo
- Polar fleece sweatshirt with the school logo
- School PE T-shirt (for physical education purposes)
- School jacket with the school logo

Other uniform items:

Socks, navy or black. Navy tights. Footwear appropriate for an active school life.

The school may vary the prescribed uniform items. In this case, previously approved prescribed uniform items may continue to be worn until the item is no longer of wearable quality, or until there is a significant uniform change following consultation with the school community.
